## HOW OFTEN SHOULD YOUR TANK BE PUMPED?

Below is a chart with recommended pumping frequencies for your tank. The frequencies estimated are based on minimum 24-hour wastewater retention time and 50 percent digestion of the solids entering the tank. More frequent pumping would be needed if garbage disposals were utilized.
